Look at the BIG picture

Step back and assess – Sound, Appearance, Musicianship

Seating Placement

Consider the space, the music, and the needs of the players Placement of principal players - Location of bass voices - Horn seating Does it matter? It's all about tuning, precision and balance. Change it up!

Posture

Chairs: Ya gotta dance with what brung ya
The dreaded diseases: Individual instrument considerations (Flute-droop, Hunch-n-Scrunch, Instrumental
Recline) Neck strap and mouthpiece considerations
No touching allowed! (elbows, legs, ankles)
I like to move it, move it.

Assessing the First Sounds

Ensemble tone and color - Open throat, teeth and ears! Listen/emulate/experiment Balancing Act - Use of the pyramid four ways Your reed is your friend – so use it!

Breathing

Deeply with focus Where, when, how, why - In style/in tempo Dynamics: air speed (velocity) vs. air volume (quantity)

Phrasing

What are you trying to say? - The conversations within Cause and effect Lean on it

Intonation

Using a tuner - Using your ears and your eyes Ask a friend/ask the ensemble Beats and vibrations ...

To conduct or NOT to conduct? THAT is the question!

When it is time to relinquish control Making the players responsible It's all about communication

Expression

Educational Learning Packets Articulation: ping pong or bowling Recordings Become the music!
